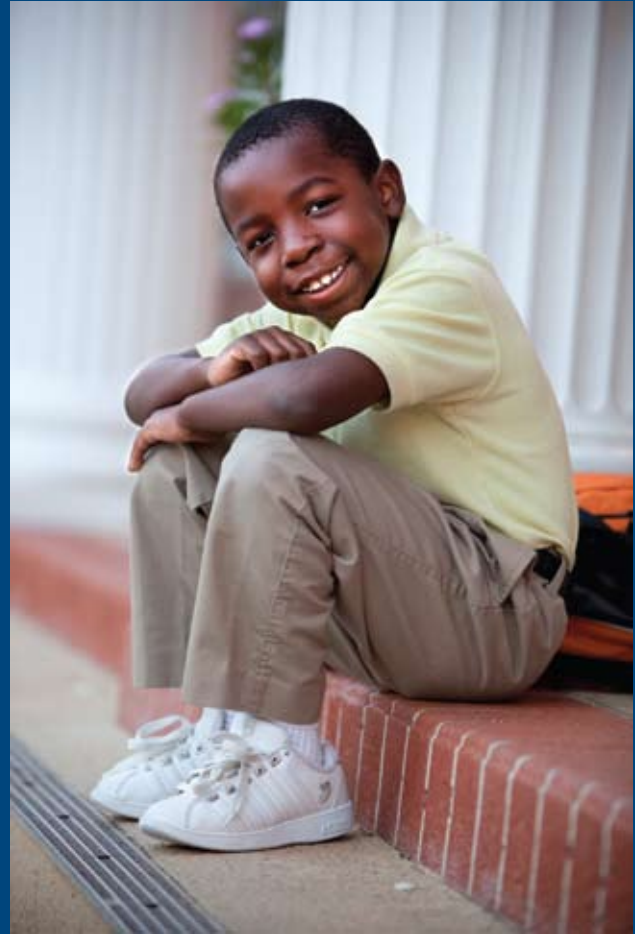

ALMOST A YEAR AGO JOHN AND I were told that our baby girl Ryann had Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia. She had just celebrated her 4th birthday days before the diagnosis. She was immediately hospitalized to begin treatment. Our three older children, Payton, Bruin, and Brenleigh, were right in the middle of school, football, cheerleading,



etc. We had to focus on Ryann but also make sure that they were okay. From that first day in the hospital, the visits, calls, and messages started pouring in from our Landmark family. I had a friend later tell me that when the news spread at chapel, everyone was crying and hugging each other saying, "We will get them through this." That is exactly what

they did. The love that we felt got our family through the most difficult thing we have ever faced.

We have seen first-hand God working for us through everyone. Ryann will be undergoing treatment until December 2012, and we hope to have her in kindergarten at Landmark next year. I can think of no other place we would rather have

her. Landmark is truly our family, and it brings us to tears every time we think of the love and support that we have experienced here. It makes us all want to love and serve even more. It has truly made a difference in our lives, and we are eternally blessed and grateful.

The above figures represent the budget for Landmark for the fiscal year which began August 1, 2010, and ended July 31, 2011. This budget was based on 795 students and was approved in final form by the Board of Directors in October 2010.

Charitable support contributed to Landmark may be unrestricted or restricted. Substantial portions of the unrestricted gifts are directed toward financial aid, staff development, classroom enhancements, technology, and similar annual projects. Gifts which are restricted by donors are used for the purposes specified at time of donation. Because the nature of many charitable gifts to the institution is capital, the institution typically does not budget such gifts or corresponding capital expenditures operationally; nor does it budget for non-expenditure usages of funds such as establishment of reserves or depreciation. In order to present a complete picture of our school's finances for the year ended July 31, 2011, all such extra-budget items are included above.

During the 2010-2011 fiscal year, Landmark remained within the parameters of its budget without material exception and finished the year in positive territory.

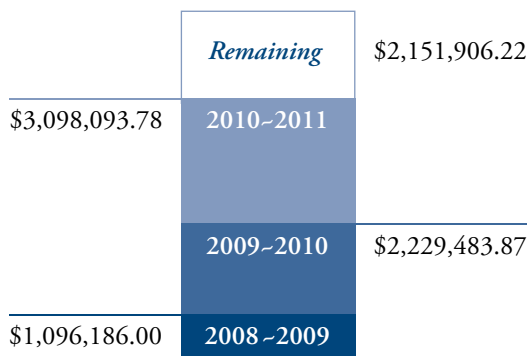
GIVING SUMMARY

Campaign Impact is a six-year initiative by Landmark Christian School to attract \$5.25 million in private gifts. Gifts will underwrite specific institutional priorities as clearly spelled out within the campaign's three "impact goals." The campaign time clock began on August 1, 2008, and will end on July 31, 2014.

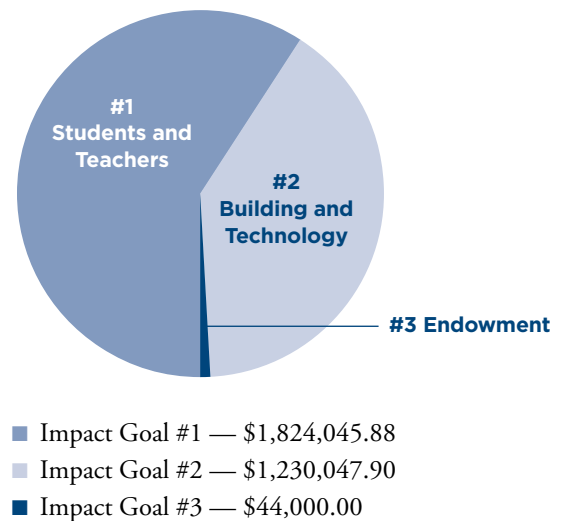
The total of ALL cash gifts received by Landmark Christian School between August 1, 2010 and July 31, 2011 was \$979,331. This includes \$830,495 in undesignated gifts, and \$148,836 in designated gifts received by the Office of Advancement, not including memberships and other income.

Total Amount Raised For Campaign Impact by Impact Goals



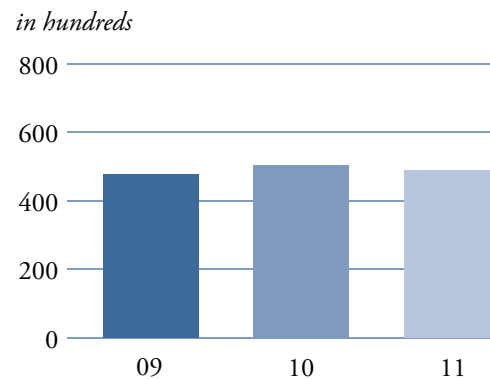

CAMPAIGN IMPACT GIFTS AND COMMITMENTS

Campaign Impact is a six-year, \$5.25 million comprehensive effort which began in August 2008. There are three unique and measurable "impact" goals within the campaign, which are explained below – one for specific annual operational priorities, another for buildings and technology, and the last for endowment. While many of our most faithful donors choose year-to-year how much they will give to Landmark, others have made up to a five-year pledge of support. In this way the school can plan and budget ahead. As you review the donor rolls that follow, you may notice the same name a time or two. These donors have made a financial commitment supporting more than one impact goal. Each of these gifts is counted towards the overall six-year fundraising objective and the individual impact goal objectives, which are:

Impact Goal #1: Students and Teachers – \$3 million

Impact Goal #2: Buildings and Technology – \$1.725 million

Impact Goal #3: Endowment – \$525,000

Total for *Campaign Impact* = \$5.25 million

IMPACT GOAL #1

Impact Goal #1 is the one annual charitable drive to which every family is expected to participate to the best of their ability. 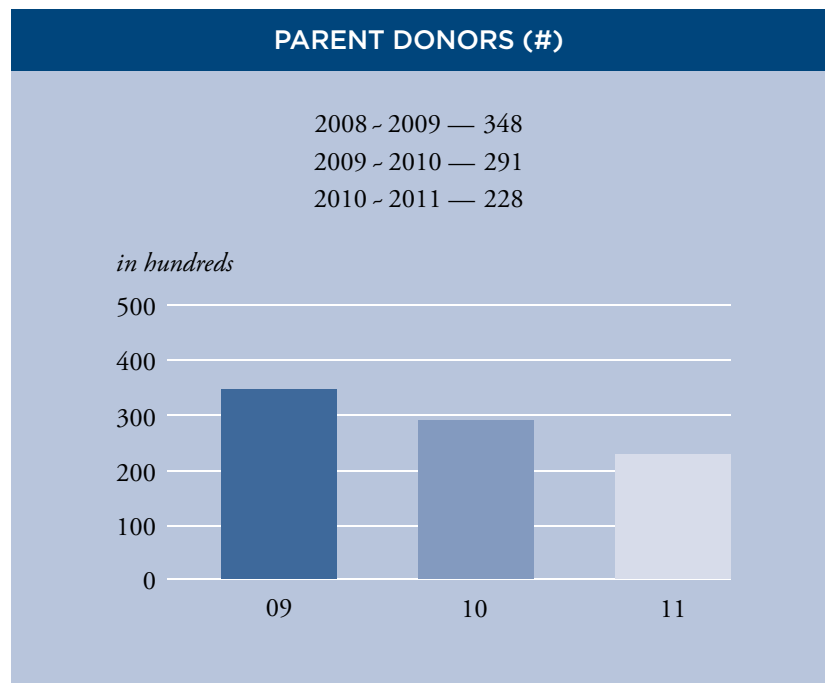
